

Asphalt Plants Can Be A Good Neighbor!! – Environmental Information to Support This Claim

HMA Environmental Fact Sheet:

- Asphalt mixture production is a closely regulated industry and each facility is required to meet very stringent permit restrictions established by the Colorado Department of Public Health & Environment. ([read more](#))

The Clayton Group Study:

- The Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) from an asphalt plant is minimal. It is similar to 13 residential fireplaces operating during the course of a year, or a bakery operating for two weeks. ([read more](#))

Delisting Letter:

- As a result of improved technology and operational best practices, the US EPA in 2002 delisted asphalt plants from the list of major polluters. ([read more](#))
